Working together, we can offer our homeless neighbors the support they need to return to permanent homes of their own.

### FOOD:

- milk, juice, coffee
- cheese, butter
- luncheon meats, poultry
- cereal, oatmeal
- soups
- bread
- fruit, vegetables
- sugar, sweeteners, creamer
- salt, pepper
- mayonnaise, mustard, ketchup
- salad dressing
- cooking oil

# KITCHEN ITEMS:

- paper plates, bowls, and cups
- plastic utensils, Styrofoam cups
- paper towels
- napkins
- aluminum foil, plastic wrap
- toasters, coffee makers, blenders, canopeners

- pots, frying pans, baking pans
- drinking glasses, mugs
- potholders

# CLEANING SUPPLIES:

- brooms, dust pans, mops (heads and handles), buckets
- sponges, scouring pads
- vacuum cleaners
